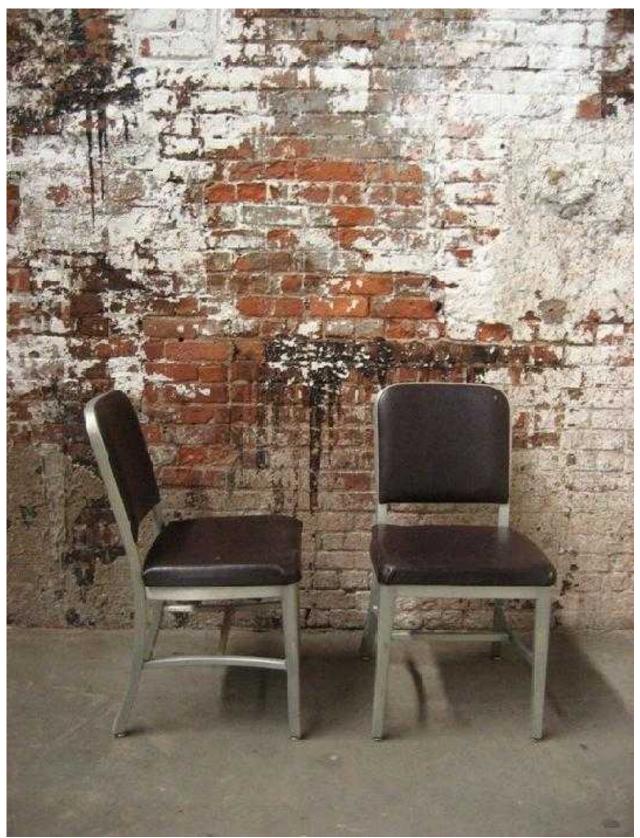

#1 Old brick basement foundations can be made beautiful.



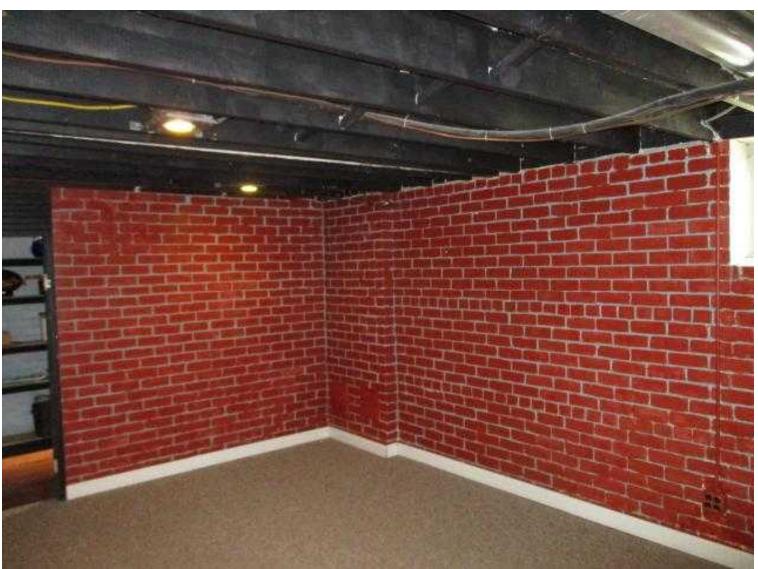
#2 Sand or water blast to remove old paint and plaster. Be sure to check for leak paint. Leaving some paint or plaster can give it a nice antique look.

#9 Nice job except for the carpet. Black open ceiling, painted concrete walls.



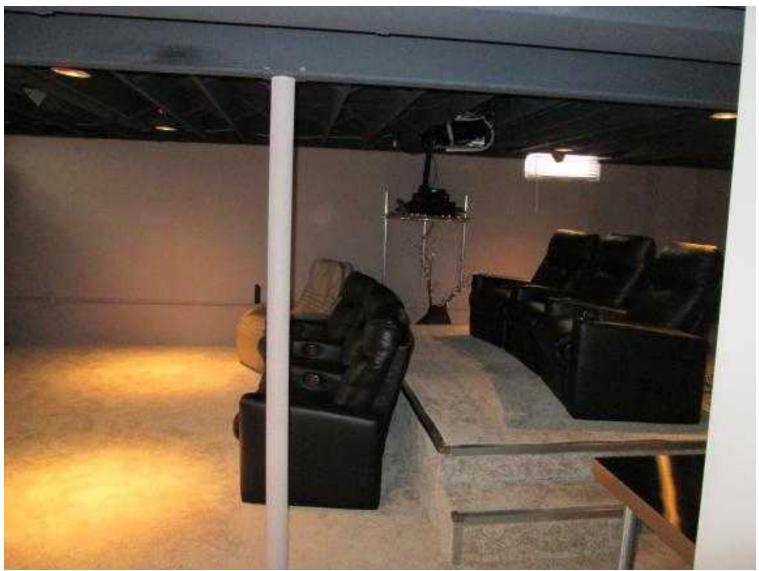
#10 Dark gray ceiling.

r. Ceiling black, painted concrete walls. Love everything but the carpet.



























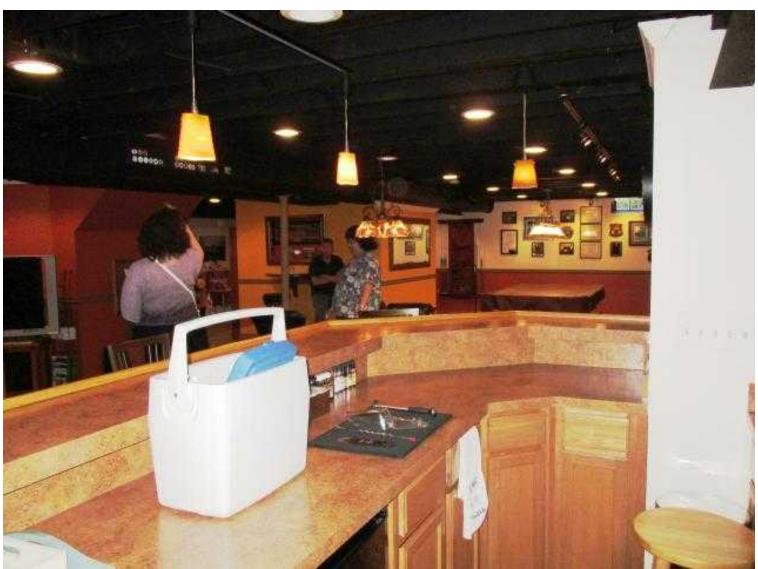












#33 Notice all the lights. Lighting is critical to a nice basement. Don't spare expense on this. You are saving plenting by not studding out, insulating and drywalling.

#47 These are good reasons to NOT stud out, insulate and drywall your basements. Rod hole leaks which will not be seen if you cover them with drywall. This will allow mold to grow.
